Carmen Forgan



David Law

David Law is a passionate supporter of youth and community music-making. He studied Euphonium at the Queensland University of Technology and has been playing piano since the age of eight. David is the founding president of the Queensland Wind Orchestra, an award-winning and internationally recognised ensemble that he also conducts within his role of Artistic Director. Additionally, David is in his 16th year of conducting the Queensland Youth Orchestra Wind Ensemble and was the conductor of Brisbane's Westside Orchestra for 20 years. David regularly works with the Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra, Ignite Choir and various community-focused instrumental and vocal ensembles as a guest conductor.

David has been an invited clinician, consultant and conductor for Queensland Music Festival's Cape York Instrumental Program, Griffith University's Australian Honours Ensemble Program, Griffith University's State Honours Ensemble Program throughout Queensland, and has been a sectional lecturer with the University of Queensland Symphony Orchestra. Additionally, David has adjudicated at state and national competitions including the West Australian Schools' Concert Band Festival, Education Queensland's Fanfare, the Queensland Catholic Music Festival and Queensland's MusicFest. He has worked as Music Director, Conductor and Pianist with various musical theatre organisations throughout Brisbane and has trained in Music Direction at the multiple–Tony–Award–winning Goodspeed Musical Theatre Institute in

Connecticut, USA. More recently, David has been an invited clinician as part of Opera Queensland's *Sing with Opera Queensland* program.

As Head of Performance Music at Redeemer Lutheran College in Brisbane, David directs a number of award-winning primary and secondary wind bands, string orchestras and vocal ensembles.



Dr. Matthew van Emmerik

Born in Bendigo, Victoria, Australia in 1978 – Matthew started playing Baritone Horn at age 7. He is the former principal euphonium player with the Central Band of the Royal Air Force based in London, United Kingdom and all Royal Australian Navy Bands.

He has held high profile recording and principal/section positions on euphonium, tuba and bass trumpet with the world's leading bands and orchestras including: Black Dyke, Fodens, Leyland, Desford Colliery, Brighouse and Rastrick, Cory, Dalewool (NZ), Woolston (NZ), Victoria Brass, National Band of Australia and the Fountain City Band (U.S.A) – Australian Pop's Orchestra, Melbourne Opera, Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra, Auckland Philharmonia, Melbourne Symphony, Sydney Symphony, West Australian Symphony Orchestra, the Malaysian Philharmonic, Melbourne Philharmonic Orchestra, the Oporto National Orchestra – Portugal, the Iceland Symphony Orchestra, the Singapore Symphony and the Louisville Orchestra (U.S.A).

In 2007 Matthew was awarded the coveted Champion of Champions title at the National Brass Band Championships, and in 2011 became only the second Australian in history to win the Open Euphonium Championship at the New Zealand Brass Band Championships. Matthew has adjudicated contests and festivals all across Australia, New Zealand, the U.S.A and Europe. He has conducted many high-level wind and brass bands in Australia and overseas and is the principal conductor of Victoria Brass, one of the leading brass bands in Australasia.

Matthew completed his PhD studies and graduated as a Doctor of Music from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music and University of Sydney in 2011. He has recorded four commercially available CDs: 'Neath Austral Skies, 'Utaki – The Sacred Grove', 'Homeland', featuring repertoire commissioned and composed specifically for him, this CD received critical acclaim. Matthew's latest research CD project; 'Preserving Code', included recording and compiling all of the 11 solos by famed Australian composer, conductor and instrumentalist; Percy Code, for the first time in history and was released on the Potenza Music label (U.S.A). Matthew's CD release 'Utaki' and his latest project 'Preserving Code' received the coveted 'CD of the Month' Award in the Brass Band World Magazine (UK) and was also a finalist for the 'Solo CD of the Year' Award in the same Magazine. He is the most recorded euphonium soloist in Australasia.

Since 2006, Matthew has been the euphonium, tuba, low brass professor and ensemble conductor at the Sir Zelman Cowen School of Music, Monash University. Matthew also held the same position at the Melbourne Conservatorium of Music, The University of Melbourne until 2016. Matthew has held full-time positions as Director of Bands, Director of Music and Head of Music positions both in the U.S.A and Australia.

In December 2016 Matthew performed with the world renowned 'Chicago Symphony Orchestra' Brass section at the opening concert of the Midwest Conference at Symphony Center, Chicago.

Matthew is proud to be a Shires and Eastman Musical Instrument Company Brass Artist and Clinician and an endorsee of Reunion Blues gig bags.

Matthew uses his own VAN EMMERIK signature mouthpiece range when performing.


Matthew is married to his beautiful wife Monique, and they have two son's William 11 and Patrick 8.


Parking:
